Aphra for Love, being so kind and considerate and Fred for Individuality and being true to himself in Willow Tree Class.


Jack for Learning and amazing effort and Ruby for Love and always being kind and helpful in Mountain Ash Tree Class.

Dining experience changes

The School Council, made up of children from Year 6, have been working hard with Ms Fernyhough to gather opinions and formulate a plan regarding our children's dining experience. This Monday they ran the whole school assembly and explained to the rest of the school how they had taken all the children's feedback and come up with a plan to make the dining experience a really lovely and social time.

Some examples of issues children raised were

- not having long enough to eat

- that the older children have to eat in $4^{\mbox{th}}$ sitting when the hall can be messy and dirty from previous sittings

- some children have been rushing out to playtime and just throwing their food straight in the bin - some children have been disrespectful to others about what they have chosen to eat or is in their lunchboxes.

Proposed plan from the School Council:

•We won't waste food.


•We will always clear up any food around us – on the floor, table or chair – before going out to play.

•Year 5 and 6 will make sure they stack their own chair in the correct place.

And some incentives:

- •We will change our seating plan every half term.
- •Each table will have a name.
- •Raffle tickets will be given out for good behaviour and great table manners and social skills and drawn in Friday's assembly where prizes will be awarded.
- •A table of the week will be chosen on a Friday after watching out for good eating and behaviour throughout the week. That table becomes THE GOLDEN TABLE for the following week – table cloth, napkins, flowers and everything!!
- •There will be a shout out board.
- •There will be a Riddle of the Day on the board to be solved on your table each day!
- •There will be Question/Picture cards on your table each day enjoy the conversation.
- Each class will be joined by the adults from their classroom and everyone will stay at their tables for 15 minutes before going out to play (the children can eat for longer if they need to!)

We are now 3 days into the new plan and although we have to iron out some timing issues the atmosphere and dining experience is quite transformed – genius thinking school council!

Message from the SEND Team

We wanted to inform you of some recent changes to local services if you are needing family support or have concerns about a specific issues with your child. What was previously the

Children's Centre are now called Totnes Family Hub and they are offering early intervention support for families, children, and young people 0-19 years (25 years if a SEND need).

They recognise that early intervention is very important, and want to support families, their children and young people as quickly as possible with all areas of parenting. Therefore, parents or a professional can scan the QR code to fill in the 'request for contact' and someone from the Family Hub team will attempt to call the parent within 48 hours of receiving the request. Parents can also drop into the Family hub (Totnes Family Hub, Pathfields, Totnes, TQ95TZ) to request contact. They will then offer a single session appointment using a supportive strengths based approach to discuss the area of concern and provide strategies to support. They will signpost and make referrals to professionals if necessary.

They are also running regular support for children with speech and language delay and a weekly SEND group at the Totnes Family Hub (Totnes Family Hub, Pathfields, Totnes, TQ95TZ)).

They have a new bump to pre-walkers group up and running at Totnes Family Hub every Tuesday (please see the attached poster and also have the open space available to families and their children/young people, every Monday afternoon (please see attached). They also have baby weigh at Totnes Family Hub Monday to Friday.




