World Book Day

This year we will be celebrating World Book Day on **Friday 7th March** and we have lots of fun things planned for the day. The children will be able to come to school dressed as a book character or in their pyjamas - second hand costumes are for sale in the reception area.

Book Swap!

We aren't collecting mufti money this time, but if you would like to donate a preloved, good quality book from your family, then we are collecting these in the reception area. (Please can we request that you don't donate annuals, colouring books etc) On World Book Day, we are hoping that these boxes will be available throughout the day for the children to choose a book from should they wish to, but this will depend upon the number of books donated.

Reading Café

During the afternoon of World Book Day (7th March) from 2pm until 5pm we will be running a reading café in the school hall, like we did last year, where parents/carers can come in and share books with their children. There will also be tea, coffee, squash and cakes for sale and parents/carers can come drop in at a time convenient for them.

Competition

We'd like to invite the children to join in with our competition linked to World Book Day by making a 3D book character/scene! Entries can be brought in from next Monday and need to be in by March 7th in order to be entered into the competition. Author Visit

We have an extremely exciting visitor coming into The Grove on Wednesday 12th March.

Anthea Simmons is a local author who has written a range of fantastic books. She will be sharing these with key stage 2 in addition to encouraging children at The Grove to share books they enjoy and start writing their own stories. KS2 will be sharing their stories and recommendations with KS1 and reception as part of Anthea's visit and continuing our celebration of books and story-writing after World Book Day the preceding week.

Anthea's biography is below along with some books which are available to buy, these are more appropriate for Key Stage 2, Anthea has written books for smaller children which are available second hand on Amazon but are no longer in print. If your child purchases a book they will have the opportunity to get it signed after Anthea has finished working with the children.



Anthea started writing books from about the age of seven but only took it up seriously in 2009 with her first picture book, 'Share', published by Andersen Press in 2010. Two more picture books followed - 'The Best, Best Baby' and 'I'm Big Now' and all have sold well and been translated into lots of languages. Her first children's novel, 'Lightning Mary' about the young Dorset fossil-finder, Mary Anning, won the STEAM Prize for middle-grade fiction. This book was followed by 'Burning Sunlight' a novel about young climate activists and a

greenwashing scandal - and 'The Secret Garden Rewilded', a retelling of the classic with the location shifted to Dartmoor and a focus on biodiversity.

Anthea grew up in Cornwall, got a degree in English from Oxford and then worked for several years in financial services where she held senior management roles. She now lives on the edge of Dartmoor with two extremely naughty cats (Pixie and Percy) and a very feisty little chestnut thoroughbred former racehorse, known as Lion. She has one (lovely!) grown-up son.

When she isn't writing books, she is campaigning for social justice, democratic engagement and climate action. She is editor-in-chief for online paper, West Country Voices.




Speaking up against Racism
