Message from the Chair of Governors

Update from the governors

Well, what a first half term this has been. The Board of Governors met yesterday to have our first procedural meeting of the year – with the budget being an area of focus at this time of year. All is well in that area, with no concerns. It has been managed incredibly well through an unforecastable year, so well done to everyone, especially Sandie.

As you will expect, the majority of our current meetings and my catch-ups with Mrs Priest and Mrs Wilkinson concentrate on the wellbeing and support for the children, parents and staff. We discuss the decisions being faced by school, offering support, challenge and advice, and yesterday was no different. As Mrs Priest has said in this newsletter, the latest iteration of the remote learning provision is now running. As a board we are very pleased to see how this has taken shape over the year, taking input from parents and children. We will continue to provide our input and support as a Board.

This has been a very tough start to the year for us all, and one which has put many things into conflict as we try to juggle the expectations on us as employers, employees, parents and family members. Unfortunately this has been one of those times where there is no clear and obvious way to keep everything afloat, but please be assured that all decisions are scrutinised and do have to factor things which are not always clear and obvious.

One thing I must say is thank you. Thank you for the support you have given to your children, and thank you to the staff in school. Also thank you to those who have reached out to me to discuss issues – not everything is easy or without problems, but it does help to discuss them and feed them back into the discussions we have on things like attendance, remote learning, etc.

One final point is that I have taken the feedback from our meetings, from parents and my own personal thoughts as a Governor and parent, and have written to our MP for Totnes to highlight the many issues facing schools and children/parents during this lockdown. The letter is attached to this newsletter, and I have since had a productive phone call with Mr Mangnall and will have another in the coming weeks after he has met with ministerial colleagues for School Standards, etc, and raised the points there. These things are not quick at affecting change, but I hope you agree it is important to feed them back so that mistakes are not repeated.
