A WELCOME MESSAGE FROM THE FOUNDER

Dear Parents and pupils,

Welcome to the Junior Duke Award!

Thank you very much for taking on the challenge! I hope you have received your Duke Journal and have begun to work on the first few tasks.

I am the primary teacher who created the Junior Duke Award because I had numerous pupils in my classes, in my rugby teams and on outdoor expeditions who seemed to lack key life skills. Some found tying laces hard, others had never spread butter on bread and there were some young children who didn't know how to fix an inside-out shirt-sleeve when changing after PE.

Whether working on the challenges in school or together at home, it is very important that, once a skill has been learned for the task, regular practice—takes place so that it becomes automatic.—I know that sometimes, for parents, doing tasks yourself is faster and less messy but, given repeated apportunity to practice, it's impressive how quickly children become proficient, making family life easier!

I am a mum of two teenage boys whom, at times, would love to be waited on hand and foot but I am so glad that we persevered over the years (and mostly controlled the urge to take over!) and now they are well-able to cook dinner (and clear up!), shop on a budget and do the washing so that we can be more of a team in the house AND so that we know they'll be able to look after themselves when they leave home!

After 28 years of teaching, this is my first year without a class. I very much miss hearing children's stories and seeing their pride when they complete a challenge. However, hearing your stories makes up for it!
