School security

You may have heard that two children left the school premises on Monday. We were aware very quickly that they had left the premises and identified who it was through the registers and with the help of our kind community they were quickly brought back to school.

Access points to the school are not permitted to be locked from the inside, and the push buttons to exit have to be at wheelchair access height. This does introduce an element of risk, and in response we will be conducting a Governor lead review into this incident, our procedures and access points. This is something which is in part already underway, as we have already this term engaged a local firm to help us improve our entry and exit doorways. We will also ensure we have an increased staff presence at the rear gate.

We do trust the children not to put themselves in this situation and monitor this carefully, but will address this subject with them directly through class and assembly discussions, and would ask that you also have a conversation with your children.
