

Saltmarsh Seed Bombs

Make, Launch, Share, Observe

Ecologists, scientists, artists and designers are working together this autumn on a local project called **Living Dart: The Saltmarsh Project.** You might be surprised to hear that outside the Tropics saltmarshes bury carbon at a greater rate and store more carbon per unit area below ground than their forest counterparts on land. They absorb tidal and wave energy and help prevent flooding. They regulate water quality by absorbing excess phosphates and nitrates in river water as well as salt from the incoming tides. They are important places for wading birds to breed, spend the winter and stop off during migration. Muddy, grey and brown, the Dart's pockets of saltmarsh often go unnoticed—our project aims to help protect them.

Right now, the project team is planning a range of restoration techniques. We are experimenting with 'seed bombing' as one way to help the saltmarshes become more diverse and more established. We would like to know if you-students and parents-would like to help us? We would like to do this in the next few weeks, one day after school or at the weekend.

We would make small balls of mud (from the areas of saltmarsh) and native seeds. When the seed bombs are dry we'll head down to Long Marsh, launch them into the mud, and then—over time—see what grows. We might see more Sea Aster—a native herb, full of minerals, that doesn't mind getting its roots wet. If we are lucky, ecologist Nigel Mortimer will share with us everything he knows about the Dart's saltmarshes. And next March we will be having a big event to celebrate our work—and the future we have made brighter for these fragile ecosystems. You could be part of this project and could learn all about it... and, of course, be invited to the event, meet the team and see what the artists make. Every time you visit Long Marsh, you could see how the saltmarsh is doing... we need people who live here to be stewards for these special places.
