World Book Day

This year we will be celebrating World Book Day on **Friday 6th March** and we have lots of fun things planned for the day. The children will be able to come to school dressed as a book character or in their pyjamas and the PTA will be selling second hand costumes in the reception area from Monday 23rd February.

Book Swap!

We aren't collecting mufti money for this year, but if you would like to donate a preloved, good quality book from your family, then we will be collecting these in from Monday the 23rd February. There will be a box at the front entrance to put your donations in. (Please can we request that you don't donate annuals, colouring books etc) On World Book Day, we are hoping that these books will be available throughout the day for the children to choose a book from should they wish to, but this will depend upon the number of books donated.

Reading Café

During the afternoon of World Book Day (6th March) from 2pm until 4pm we will be running a reading café in the school hall, like we did last year, where parents/carers can come in and share books with their children. There will also be tea, coffee, squash and cakes for sale and parents/carers can come drop in at a time convenient for them.

Competition

We'd like to invite the children to join in with our competition linked to World Book Day by decorating a paper plate connected to a favourite book/character. We will be sending home a paper plate before the half term with every child and they need to be returned by Friday 6th March to be entered into the competition. We will be sharing ideas for decorating the plates and the children can decorate their plates at school on World Book Day if they'd rather.

There will be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize for each key stage and some runners up prizes too.

Competition winners will be announced in the week after World Book Day and the plates will be displayed in the school corridor as part of our literacy display.



ROYAL ACADEMY OF ARTS COMPETITION

Behaviour as communication – anxiety – Week 2

Lots of things can cause children anxiety about school and parents often see this before school when time is short, everyone is in a hurry and it's hard to address. If you have had this experience, it is often useful to choose a non-pressured time to chat about things. Bed time can work for some but for those children who don't like to go to bed on time this can be a tactic to extend the bedtime deadline and often everyone is tired and adults still have 100 jobs still to do so patience can be thin. Try a time when you are out for a walk or in the car, children often open up more when they don't feel like they are being quizzed and don't have to look straight at you. Sometimes with older children texting can be a useful way of drawing out worries.

In school we:

Make sure the child has a trusted adult they can talk to when they need to

Operate the meet and greet system to help in the separation process from parents to school

Take a little Lola dog walk with the trusted adult as a chance to talk (Lola works on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays)

Use picture cues to help express emotions

Consider the usual suspects – friendships, learning, home life, play times, food, illness (or fear of illness), separation anxiety from parents, changes to routines, facing an 'unknown' scenario

Give lots of cuddles and reassurance

Try to tackle the root cause if we can
