### 2024 statutory assessment results

We are very proud of these results and the staff and children who worked so hard to achieve them.

Early Years Foundation Stage 75% achieved their Early Learning goals in the prime areas.

Year I phonics 90% passed.

Year 4 timetables – these results are not published but children scored an average of 20/25 correct. Year 6 reading 92% gained expected with 60% gaining Greater Depth (national is 74%) Year 6 spelling, grammar and punctuation 85% gained expected with 42% gaining Greater Depth

(national is 72%)

Year 6 maths 94% gained expected with 40% gaining Greater Depth (national is 73%) Year 6 writing 81% gained expected with 27% gaining Greater Depth (national is 72%) Year 6 Science 90% gained the expected level (national is 81%)

This means that 81% of our children gained at least expected level in reading, writing and maths compared to national 61%. All of our children who took the tests gained expected or better in at least one subject and did so very well.

Individual results will go out with the school reports.

### Children's school reports for 23-24

The children's school reports will come out on Wednesday next week. Due to a family bereavement we don't have Rebecca with us currently, so this year we are printing out the reports and sending them home via your child. Please check for it on Wednesday and let us know if it didn't make it to you. We will try to send 2 copies home for separated parents but please remind us if we need to post it or accidently forget one. It's at times like this we recognise exactly how much Rebecca does behind the scenes and how good she is at making the admin run smoothly.

### Explaining the school reports

As the school reports should be with you next week we thought it would help just to explain a little of the terminology we use.

For Reception, the areas of development in Early Years are

- communication and language.
- personal, social and emotional development.
- physical development.
- literacy.
- mathematics.
- understanding the world.
- expressive arts and design.

The first 5 of these have specific comments in the report and the last 2 are within passions and strength and general comments.

For the other year groups there are subject based areas of learning, which have their own sections for comment in the report

- reading
- writing
- maths

And these other subjects which are covered within passions and strength and general comments.

History, Geography, Science, Music, Physical Education, Religious Education, Personal, Social, Health (incl. mental health) and Economic Education, Design Technology, Computing and Information Technology and Spanish (in KS2)

You will also see a grid like this under reading, writing and maths and a x next to the row that fits your child's attainment and progress.


Expected level is based on a national standard across the country for their year group.

Emerging means that your child is working towards the expected standard for their year group and haven't quite mastered all areas of the curriculum.

Greater Depth means that your child has a very secure grip of knowledge and skills and is developing their deeper understanding in these subjects for their year group.

In terms of progress the majority of children make expected progress – compared to the expected standard in September vs the expected standard in July. Some children's progress comes in fits and starts and is more of a roller coaster journey and some make accelerated progress some years and not expected progress in other years. It is important to remember that every child is different and we support their learning based on their individual needs and if you want to talk more to the teachers about why your child is marked at a particular box then email the teacher or fill in the form at the bottom of the report and they can arrange a chat.

The next steps box indicts your child's next steps with these national standards and all areas of curriculum in mind.



### The Grove School Food Vision, represented through Year 5's Self-Portraits

Recently the Year 5 children created some hand drawn self-portraits using fruits and vegetables, inspired by the artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo. They learned about the Italian artist, best known for creating paintings which used fruits, vegetables, books, animals and other objects to represent people and then drew their own self-portraits inspired by the artist, using fruits and vegetables they like to eat, particularly as snacks. All clubs will be operating for a minimum of four hours for four days and will include a hot meal. Rehearsals have already begun but it's not too late to join!


