What's happening this week and next

Drop off and pick up is still from the far side of the field and from the front of school.


Either Mrs Wilkinson or I will be on duty at the front and back of the schools at drop off and pick up should you need to pass any messages on to staff in the classes.

Our granddaughter Harriet is travelling to the **Mpilo Hospital in Bulawayo Zimbabwe** for a week in May with a medical team of volunteers to carry out cleft lip and cleft palate surgery on children. Changing their lives forever.

There are four teams each staying for a week. Teams are made up of volunteers that include Surgeons, Doctors, Anaesthetists and Nurses from seven countries

The trip has been arranged by the American/Canadian Charity 'Operation of Hope'.

The charity has to purchase all the surgical equipment. PPE. Medicines etc that they require and this has to be shipped out and be in place at the hospital ahead of their arrival.

Harriet and the other team members are raising money for the Charity to help with the cost of the purchase and the transport to Africa of the equipment and medicines

Val and I are holding a Coffee Morning at St Johns Church Bridgetown on Friday morning the 18th March from 10am to raise funds for this purpose.
