### Leadership and management focus areas

Now that we have the children back at school and it feels as safe as it can be in the current pandemic, the school leadership team have been focusing on the impact of lockdown on learning on each individual child and a generalised picture across the school. The picture here at our school seems to reflect both the whole picture across Devon and your parental observations, which we gratefully received.

We are taking a focus lead across the school to engage the children in 'the love of writing' whilst reintroducing the structures within grammar and spelling and punctuation in a gentle way. Maths will initially be number based and reading focusing on phonics and comprehension. Healthy minds and healthy bodies are also a strong part of our initial and long term plans.

We can also see that where in lockdown we used 'worksheets' these had very little impact on learning so should we have to lockdown a bubble or school again we will try to make video input from the teachers really purposeful and meaningful.

Our very main focus is making sure that your children are happy to be in school, that we teach with a playful and play-based approach to make learning fun and enjoyable and motivating. We will be concentrating on this above all other things and of course offering a full and balanced curriculum over the school year.

#### **School reading books**

We seem to have a number of school reading books that didn't make it back to us before lockdown – could you have a good look at home and see if you have any as we need these in school. We will arrange a collection place at both entrances so the books can go into quarantine before they go back into the classes for use. Please place them in a bag labelled with the class they came from.
