Come dine with me - Spaces still available

We still have spaces on our 'Come Dine with Me' experiences for school lunches after half term. This is a bookable event with a maximum of 5 adults per day on a first come first serve basis. We are happy for adults from the same family to attend and if you have more than one child at school, we are happy for you to eat with all of your children. The cost for each adult is £2.50 and will be the same menu as the school lunch for the day so you will have to also pre-order. Your table will be booked for 12 midday. The menu for after half term will be coming soon.

For tomorrow's lunch there will be a choice of Pesto, cheese whirl (Gluten, dairy) or Coconut, sweet potato and red lentil curry

eaters but they have both told me they want school lunches everyday! I don't know what magic is now

happening in school around food, but whatever you are doing, please keep doing it!

Wow, this is such an amazing idea! Thank you for bringing this to The Grove. Our daughter is excited about it already! She is particularly impressed with having a real Italian chef in who makes their own pizza bases! She can't wait.

I love the idea of a parent come dine with me. I look forward to more news on this and the chefs in schools' project.

Which is fine, but I'm just really glad they are being stretched and encouraged to try different things. x has asked for a packed lunch a few times as a back-up, but I'd rather they just keep trying over and over again. It might take ten times for them to like some new foods but what a result!!


