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Dear Parents and Carers,

The last day of school is this Friday and we are back on Monday 28th February.

School day times from today

Based on the imminent dropping of almost all restrictions we will revert to the school finish time of 3:15pm, children may appear from 3:10 on the field from EYFS and KS1 classes so that we can still make visual clocks of parents. Can we still ask for you to stay at the second half of the field and nicely spaced at the front of the school as it is much easier to see you when there is some space between the children and the parents. Gates will close at 3:25pm, anyone later than this, then the children will wait at the front of the school with Rebecca but punctuality is appreciated.

Of course, this doesn't mean Covid has gone for us and we are still struggling to keep staff numbers up – we have 6 staff absences this week caused by Covid – another good reason for maintaining some social distancing- as we need staff well and in school to teach affectively! Thank you for your support and understanding over the last two years – this half term since Christmas has been our most challenging and worst affected Covid-wise as yet. We have had so many staff contracting Covid that has been a juggle in itself to keep classes open, but also it's been like a rolling register for the children that it is almost impossible for all the children to have learnt all the curriculum set. There will be gaps in knowledge that will take considerable time to fill.

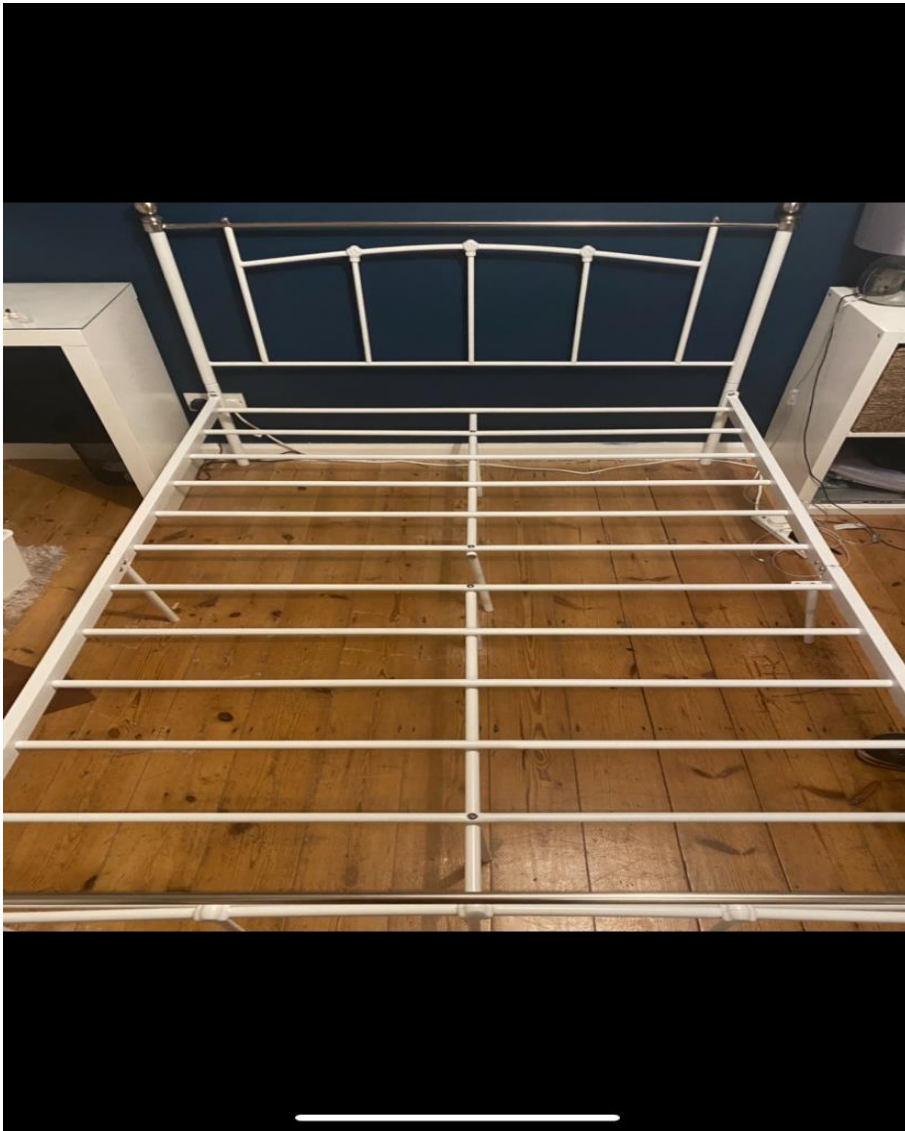

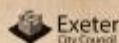
