The process for applying for a secondary place in September 2024 is now open until 31st October. In the past the LA have written to parent/carers of eligible children, but from this year they aren't doing that and so there is no reminder. Parent- teacher communication

As mentioned in our last newsletter we are trying to provide more access to teachers for you.

- 1. On Monday 18th between 3:30 and 5pm the teachers will be in their classrooms for you to go and have a chat with. Please make sure children are attended to by an adult as the school will effectively be open to all and so usual safeguarding protocols will not be in place.
- 2. We also thought we would trial a quick access time for all parents with the class teachers on Monday drop offs between 8:45 and 9am. If you want a quick face to face conversation, then please see the teacher on the school field at this time on Mondays. You will have to enter the site from the field end to do this for safeguarding purposes. Children will be going into class as usual and TAs will greet them there. This will start Monday 25th September and we will trial it until half term.

What is happening this week and next

Juniper Tree class have started their swimming lessons on Mondays. Next Monday Years 5 and 6 will be going on their trip to Paignton Zoo.

Micro, Mini and Junior Duke

To encourage independence and self-motivation, this year, The Grove School is, once again, running the Award Scheme called the Junior Duke (KS2), Mini Duke (KS1) and Micro Duke (Reception). This is aimed to be like a precursor to The Duke of Edinburgh challenge that your child may wish to take on in Secondary School.

There are four levels: in KS2; (Year 3) Bronze, (Year 4) Silver, (Year 5) Gold and (Year 6) Platinum. There are two levels in KS1; (Year 1) Silver and (Year 2) Gold. Each of these levels has ten challenges and, in order to complete a level, the children need to finish seven of these successfully. These include skills such as First Aid, ICT, Languages, Art, Drama, Music, Sport and other life skills such as cookery and puncture repair.

On completion of a level, a certificate and a badge will be awarded in assembly. All children who complete the Platinum level will receive his or her badge at assembly as soon as they have completed his or her Award, but their certificates will be awarded at a special ceremony near the end of the academic year.

There is an £11.00 charge each year to cover the cost of the booklet, certificate, badges and postage.

Your child will receive a letter with a form to fill in if they wish to take part. The form and money will need to be returned to Rebecca by Wednesday 20th September. Please look out for the letter. It would be amazing to have as many Grove children take part as possible; the benefits to your child will be huge.
