We ask people to bring a bag or box to take their veg home and to tell their friends - there is usually a lot of produce to shift & this event is not in any way targeted, all welcome to help us reduce food waste! HELP NEEDED!!

Hello everyone,

I'm getting in touch on behalf of Resilient Lives / Pizza Pirates who are urgently looking for a temporary, practical space in Totnes (or very nearby) from January while they continue their search for a longer-term building.

They do not need a full venue (although they are still looking if anyone has any ideas!) what they need is a small, workable arrangement so they can keep community sessions and pop-ups going.

What they're trying to do

They are looking for somewhere they can use on and off to:

- mix pizza dough
- store dough in a fridge to prove
 - then take it out and freeze it

They are also hoping to have their freezer plugged in somewhere else, so they can keep dough available for short-notice community activity.

What equipment is involved

- 1 x double-door commercial fridge (described as "pretty big")
- 1 x dough mixer (approx. 1m high, around 75cm diameter) If needed, they can provide more accurate measurements.

What kind of space would work

Any of the following might be suitable:

- a commercial or community kitchen with a bit of spare capacity
 - a church or hall kitchen
- a school/college/community food space (if hireable out of hours)
 - a café/restaurant back-of-house with space at quiet times
- a warehouse/store room with power (even if prep happens elsewhere) They are flexible, and they expect to pay a sensible hire/storage fee.

Key practical questions (to match the right place)

If you might be able to help, could you let us know:

- Do you have space for a large double-door fridge and a mixer?
 - Can the fridge be plugged in continuously?
- Is sessional access available (even limited hours) for dough mixing?
