Potential pre-school at The Grove- latest update!!

As mentioned in last week's newsletter we are really seriously considering a pre-school and we have had some great meetings with Devon and the governors and have had the initial go ahead to start with 11 places per session for 3 year olds. We would be able to cater for both 15 hour and 30 hour entitlement funding and with options to pay for more hours. There would be two sessions of 3 hours a day or a full day of 6 hours. We have even settled on a name – Little Grovers! Devon have to run a consultation period which takes 4 weeks and hopefully will start this week. Then if all goes well we can start advertising properly soon in June. It could be a great option for those parents who are thinking about deferring entry into Reception and really good for siblings of children at school. Being term time only and school day only we are having conversations with our breakfast club and after school providers and will get back to you on all these details. 'Books That Help' was a project initiated by the author Clare Helen Welsh to help support children with challenging emotions and experiences through the power of story and books. Being able to identify with characters in stories can be very helpful for children in general, but particularly when a child might be experiencing a challenging situation such as losing a loved one or parental separation. 
