SEND Community Provision led by Joel McIlven and The Grove SEND Team – change of time to note

We are excited to be piloting a 'Community Provision' programme at The Grove this term. This idea emerged from meetings of The Grove Community Parent SEND Group over the past few months.

We want to:

1. Bring people together to increase our collective understanding of SEN and neurodivergence

We will run a structured programme open for anybody interested in learning more about SEN and neurodivergence. This will be an opportunity to learn about and share knowledge, experience, challenges, science and theory, behavioural presentations, strategies, resources and government policy. Sessions will take place in school on Tuesday afternoons 1:30-3:00, beginning next Tuesday 20th January.

2. Come together as a community to support The Grove to help meet the needs of the children at the school

The structured programme will also act as a platform to develop a pro-active and collaborative resource of parents and community members providing in-school provision to help meet the needs of all children at The Grove. Some parents or carers are already volunteering time to support the additional needs of their children, others may have time they would like to contribute, this will be an opportunity to have a meaningful local impact.
