Dear Parents and Carers,

SATs results for The Grove School 2023.

We are very proud of our whole school's academic achievements as well as the children's personal development. Here are the SATS results across the school for this year:

EYFS (Reception) achieved 'Early learning goals with a good level of development' in all prime areas 85%

YI phonics 91% passed

KSI Y2 SATS

Reading 79% working at expected levels (national 69%) and 43% working at a greater Depth

Maths 85% working at expected levels (national 72%) and 30% working at a Greater Depth

Writing 75% expected levels (national 61%) and 30% working at a Greater Depth

KSI 68% children who achieved expected levels in all 3 Reading, writing and Maths (national 56%)

and 21% Greater Depth

Y4 Timetables Average score out of 25 was 19.3 and 42% of children were very high scorers of 23+ (no pass mark given)

KS2 Y6 SATS

Reading 93% working at expected level (national 73%) and working at Greater Depth 64%

Spelling and Grammar 82% working at expected level (national 72%)and 44% working at Greater Depth

Maths 96% working at expected level (national 73%) and 49% and working at Greater Depth

Writing 82% working at expected level (national 71%) and 11% and working at Greater Depth

Science 89% working at expected level (national 80%) (no Greater Depth grade in Science)

KS2 82% Children who attained expected in all 3 Reading writing and Maths (national 59%) and 9% Greater Depth
